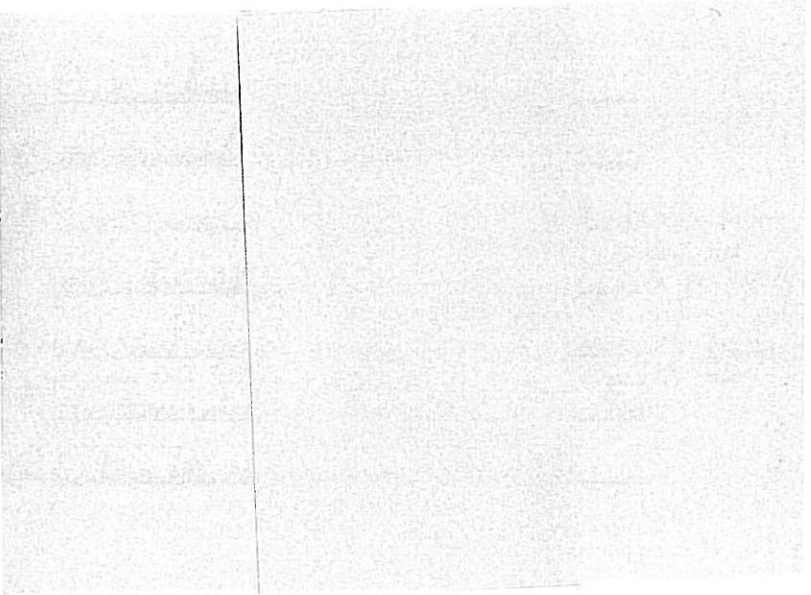
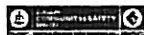
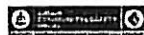


The TARA Project- Assessment of Victims of Trafficking



Eligibility for TARA support

- Women over 18 years
- Have been commercially sexually exploited in the UK
- Have been brought to the UK or have been moved around the UK

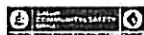


The 3 Stage Model

(Judith Herman's Stages of Recovery)

1. Establishing safety
 2. Promoting healing and integration
 3. Moving on
- TARA focuses primarily on the first stage however increasingly is involved in the other two stages.

- Other relevant support agencies
- The Intervention Team/Routes Out of Prostitution
 - Base 75
 - Counselling services
 - Community addiction team
 - JOM



TARA Support

- Emergency safe accommodation
- Emergency pack
- Health needs
- Emotional & practical support
- Onward referral
- Care planning



Referrals to TARA

- All referrals assessed
- Completion of NRM form
- 4 week assessment of needs and risks
- Continued support as necessary



Risk Assessment

1. Perpetrator
2. Involvement/contact with anyone in the sex industry
3. Immigration status
4. Entitlement to financial assistance
5. Involvement of the authorities



Risk Assessment

6. Does the woman speak any English/first language?
7. Is she in debt to anyone; how much?
8. Substance misuse
9. Psychological issues
10. Safe accommodation




Challenges in completing the interview and assessments

- General health
- Psychological trauma
- Lack of trust
- Language
- Interview venue
- Cultural and religious issues, i.e ritual oath
